1. Northern Zambia, Central Africa

Information:

Zambia is a land-locked country in the central part of Africa. The Mothers' Union in Northern Zambia are enthusiastic about outreach – helping the elderly, sick, orphans and other vulnerable community members. Seminars and education programs on child protection, marriage, gender-based violence, malaria, cancer and other illnesses are at the centre of their desire to support and encourage marriage and Christian family life. They are also committed to income-generating projects.

MU Zambia have embraced the Church Community Mobilisation Process (CCMP) and through this they are aiming to bring each organisation of the church together as a team to pray and build an outreach that will benefit the wider community. However, branches are challenged by declining attendance.

The provision of morning tea in six Family Courts is much appreciated.

The MU shop which is situated in the Town Hall Arcade is a special opportunity for outreach and ongoing ministry, providing Christian books, cards, hand-made baby and children's wear and lovely gifts (including Fair Trade items). We praise God for the Prayer Diary encouraging us to intercede for one another and for others around the world. We are grateful for the Bible Studies on the Prayers of Jesus which we have been able to share in our branches during 2019.

In association with MU Australia we are involved in supporting Overseas and Northern Outreach Projects in: Tanzania, Ethiopia, North-West Australia, Northern Territory and North Queensland.

We are grateful to God for the constant support and encouragement of our members who make these Christ-centred ministries possible.

In the Diocese of Sydney we are constantly being challenged to respond to the needs of our expanding cosmopolitan city (with its five million plus people) and beyond. The breakdown of family life with its increased violence, extreme financial and time pressures, significant cultural changes, and the widespread use of modern electronic technology – all contribute to increasing feelings of isolation and loneliness.

In attempting to meet these personal and spiritual needs MU Sydney conducts: Annual Seminars related to children and family needs ('Between a Rock and a Hard Place'); and 'Families Equip Courses – Parenting'.

At parish level MU Sydney financially supports family workers at Canterbury, Kingsford and Albion Park Rail.

Chaplains in public hospitals and women's detention centres benefit from our prayers and gifts.

The maternity hospital visiting ministry to parents of new babies continues. It began nearly 80 years ago at Crown Street Women's Hospital.

2. Mpwapwa, Tanzania

Information:

The Diocese of Mpwapwa, East of Dodoma, the capital, was inaugurated in 1991, carved out of the Diocese of Central Tanganyika. Mpwapwa is a fairly mountainous area, and it takes many hours to travel by car from north to south along

dirt roads that serve the district.

MU members are endeavouring to meet material and economic needs within the diocese. Leadership seminars develop skills which mobilise members and non-members to form groups that will establish micro-credit and income generating projects is an important goal. Visiting the sick, caring for those with HIV/AIDS, and supporting grandparents of orphaned children are significant parts of the work being done. They are also building an MU hostel which will generate income and be a source of support for the local community. The diocesan motto is: 'Looking unto Jesus'.

5. Rayalaseema, South India

Information:

The Women's Fellowship for Christian Service (which throughout the country has a total membership of almost two million) is affiliated to the global Mothers' Union.

The diocese of Rayalaseema (part of the Church of South India), is located in Andhra Pradesh, and is an ecumenical church uniting the Anglican, Methodist, Congregationalist, Presbyterian and Reformed Churches.

This fellowship is involved in running hospitals, orphanages, community care centres and educational institutions, such as the CSI Rayalaseema Diocesan Institute of Management

3. Gusau, Northern Nigeria

Information:

It was in this diocese within Zamfara State that Shariah legal system was first introduced in 1999. Many Christians left the state, thus affecting the diocese numerically and financially. In recent years this area of Nigeria has been targeted by Boko Haram (an Islamic terrorist group). Thousands of girls and women have been held against their will, subjected to forced marriages and relentless indoctrination. Those who resisted were often shot. Most of the surviving women no longer have homes.

Within this extremely difficult context Mothers' Union works to support family life. Members in Gusau work closely with the Girls' Guild. Gusau is a predominantly rural community with the main occupation being farming. Women are trained in developing skills that can be used to generate an income for their families so that they become financially independent.

Lord God Almighty, Ruler of the nations,
May your mercy and justice bring peace to the nation of Nigeria. We especially pray for those grieving the loss of daughters through kidnap and rape, for those mourning family members who have been killed, and all who live in constant fear of persecution and death. The Diocese of Osun, is located in the Ibadan State of Nigeria. There are 350 members in the Diocese. The Wave of Prayer is central to their calendar.
